

AdBlue in Diesel Vehicles

Introduction

AdBlue is a clean, odourless liquid made mostly of water and urea (a harmless chemical also found in fertiliser) stored in a separate tank in diesel vehicles. When the engine runs, it is automatically injected into the exhaust system to break down harmful pollutants into harmless nitrogen and water vapour before they leave the tailpipe.

Modern diesel vehicles require AdBlue as a consumable, similar to diesel fuel itself.

If it runs out, the vehicle will stop and requires towing at the renters cost.

It is the renter's responsibility to refill the AdBlue tank during their rental.

Applicable Vehicles *(as at May 2026)*

- Isuzu NNR 150 Trucks
- Mitsubishi Express Vans
- Toyota Prado 250 Series

Please check if the vehicle you are renting requires AdBlue

When to Top Up

A dashboard warning light will appear when the AdBlue level is low.

Do NOT ignore this warning — if the tank runs empty, the vehicle may not restart and towing will be at the cost of the renter.

General Top-Up Procedure

Note: Always ensure the engine is off before topping up AdBlue.

Step	Activity	Notes
1	Locate AdBlue Filler Cap	Locate the AdBlue filler cap — identified by its BLUE cap Location varies by vehicle — refer to vehicle-specific steps below
2	Open Cap Carefully	Open the cap slowly to avoid pressure release Check cap and surrounding area for any existing spillage or damage

3	Fill AdBlue	Use only approved AdBlue containers or products from a reputable Service Station Pour slowly to avoid splashing Do NOT overfill — stop when resistance is felt
4	Close Cap Securely	Replace and tighten the blue cap firmly Wipe down any minor spills immediately with water
5	Verify System Reset	Start the vehicle Allow the system to reset — the warning light should extinguish

AdBlue Tank Location

Vehicle	AdBlue Tank Location
Isuzu Trucks	Along the chassis rail next to the Diesel tank
Prado 250	Inside the fuel flap – locate the Blue Cap
Express Van	Inside the fuel flap – locate the Blue Cap
